6.1 State Diagram, State Transition Diagram

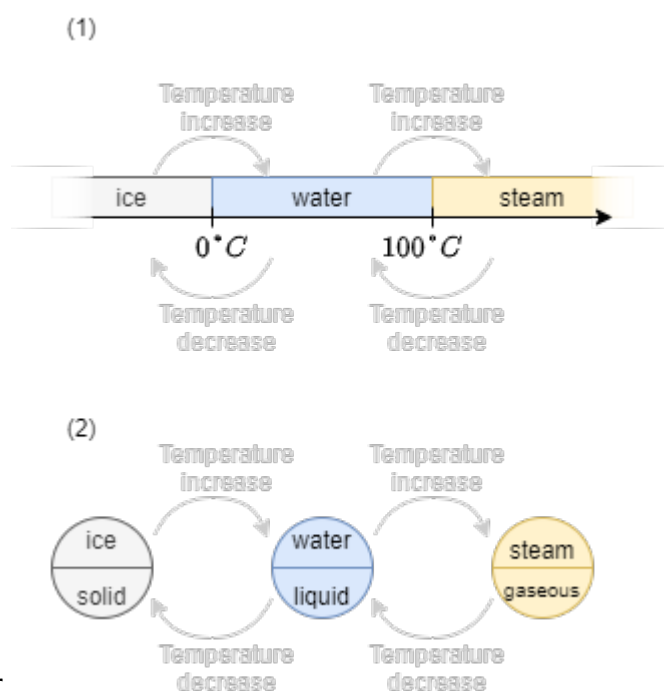


Fig. 9: State Diagram of water

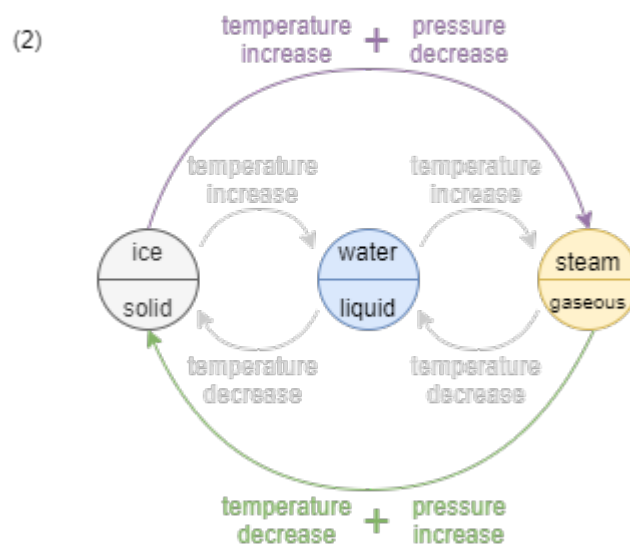
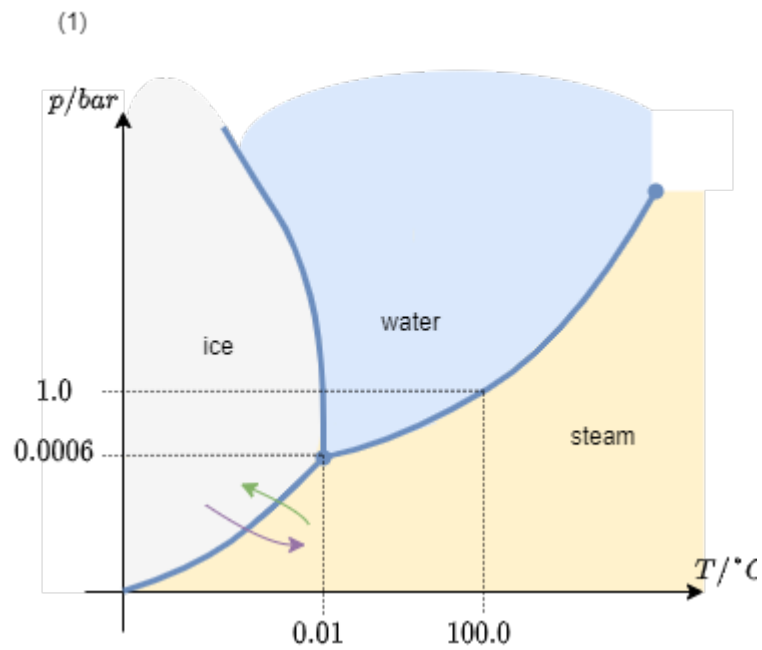


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
